## Music Stars

In music this week, Year 1 created their own melodies using short and long sounds and then performed them to the class. Year 2 had the opportunity to conduct the class, showing them whether they wanted them to play loudly or softly and quickly or slowly.

This term, KS2 are all starting to learn an instrument. Year Three have music every Thursday, and have now learned B, A and G on the recorder. They played a song using the notes B and A, along with a backing track. Year 4 continued to perfect their open and bass tones on the Djembe. They also learned how to perform a controlled drum roll and created their own call and response rhythms. Year 6 learned the A minor chord and had a go at playing a strumming pattern on the Ukulele.

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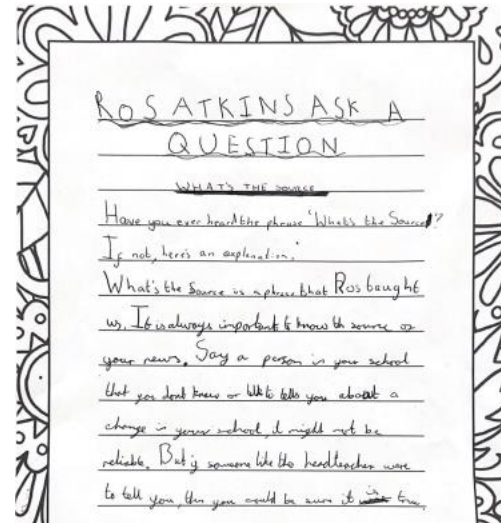
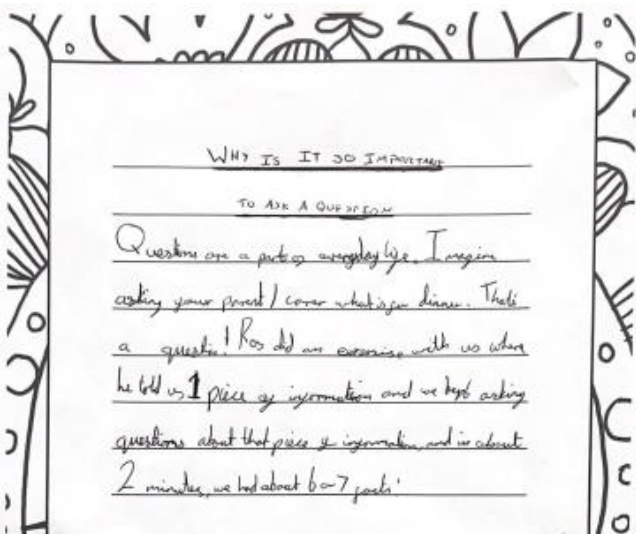
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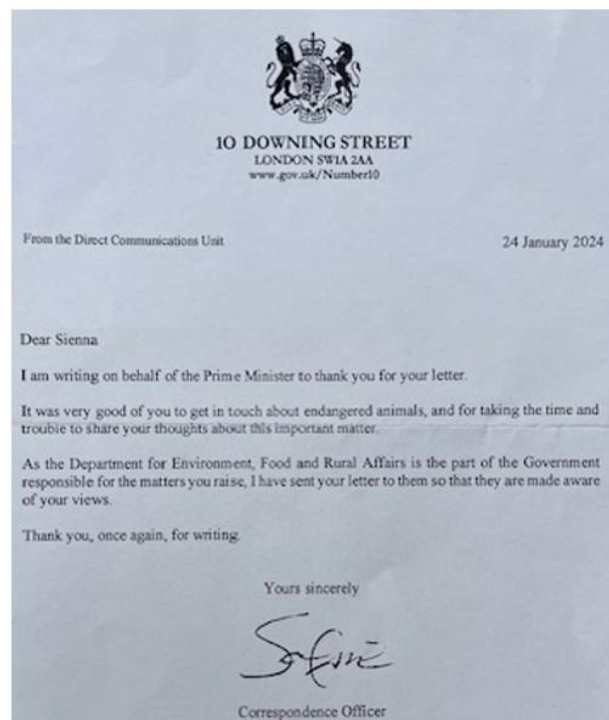
## Ros Atkins Visit
